# A Cognitive Approach to Synonymy in Terminology

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### Terminology as an autonomous subject field

- Terminology is not linguistics
  - Researchers: experts in different subject fields
  - Aim: unambiguous transfer of special knowledge
  - Terminological work: unifying concepts, standardising terms
  - Object of study: concept

### General Theory of Terminology (Wüster, 1979)

- Specialized concepts are universal, objective, clear-cut, subject specific
- They occupy a specific position within a conceptual structure and maintain logical or ontological relations with other concepts
- They are represented by terms or other symbols, which are not linguistic units

#### Terminology turns towards description

- Special language is a specific language register
  - Social and communicative constraints
- Terms are linguistic signs
  - Specific pragmatic and semantic values
- Any word in a specific context can become a term
- Concept vs. meaning

### The issue of synonymy in Terminology

- The univocity ideal: variation was avoided
- Synonymy appears in specialized texts and therefore must be described
- Onomasiological approach: Denominative variation

### Denominative variation with cognitive consequences

The concept is represented from different angles

± information	station station expérimentale
# abstraction level	<pre>productor [producer] mariscador [shellfisher]</pre>
# facets	producto mariño [sea product] producto da pesca [fishing product]
# viewpoints	zone de production [production area] zone de récolte [harvesting area]

### Challenges of Terminology

- Concept-term relation
- Denominative variation with cognitive consequences

#### Concept-term relation

- Terms are motivated by the concept
  - Purpose of term creation is to identify the concept quickly and efficiently
  - Multiword terms & special meanings attached to general words

TERM	DEFINITION
<mark>public</mark> maritime domain	Seas or ocean areas owned by the state as opposed to individuals or corporations
mouse	1. Small rodent 2. [computing] A small hand-held device which is moved over a flat surface to produce a corresponding movement of a pointer on a monitor screen []

Concept and meaning are distinct

#### Cognitive reasons for denominative variation

- Denominative variation: result of a multiple motivation
- Specialized concepts are cultural, temporal, flexible
  - Their intracategorial and intercategorial structure can vary according to functional and contextual factors

### Cognitive factors related to denominative variation

- Cognitive motivation behind denominative variation
- Cognitive structuring factors that have an effect on lexical choice
  - Subject field → perspective
  - Intention → point of view
  - Idealized Cognitive Model (ICM)

#### Subject field and perspective

- Specialized concepts cannot be attributed to a single subject field
- Presence of different subject fields (perspectives)
   on texts of shellfish farming → effect on
   denomination

#### Intention and point of view

 The intention results in the manifestation of different points of view on the same concept

#### THE OUTPUT OF THE ACTIVITY OF SHELLFISHING

management of fishing resources	recurso pesqueiro ressource halieutique stock halieutique	"En materia de conservación e mellora dos recursos pesqueiros destacan as normas destinadas á regulamentación da actividade pesqueira e das artes e aparellos permisibles en Galicia."
conservation of natural resources	especie obxecto de captura espèce exploitée	"Dans tous les cas la <b>perturbation d'une catégorie espèces</b> se répercute sur ses prédateurs ou sa nourriture et peut atteindre la dynamique des <b>espèces exploitées.</b> "
marketing of fishing products	producto do mar produit de la pêche	"L'article 4 du règlement (CE) no 104/2000 subordonne la vente au détail de certains produits de la pêche au respect d'un certain nombre de conditions visant à informer le consommateur."
human consumption	alimento do mar recursos alimentarios do mar	"Normalmente utilízase unha estratexia conservadora para calcular a taxa de <b>consumo individual</b> , utilizando para iso datos correspondentes a un <b>consumidor medio</b> ou alto de <b>alimentos do mar</b> ."

#### Idealised Cognitive Models (ICM)

Each concept is structured intracategorially and intercategorially within an ICM

#### PERSON IN THE SHELLFISHING INDUSTRY

PRODUCTION-ICM [Activity of producing something for sale]	Productor [producer]	"Funding for the Producers' Organisation is granted for a period of three years after its approval []. The amount is limited to 3% of the value of the <b>production sold</b> by the O.P.P. This value is calculated on the basis of the average <b>production</b> that each <b>producer</b> affiliated to the O.P.P has <b>sold</b> "
SHELLFISHING- ICM [Catching or breeding shellfish on shellfish banks]	<b>Mariscador</b> [shellfisher]	"Any <b>shellfisher</b> who wishes to engage professionally in the <b>shellfishing industry</b> has to join a Fishers' Association with the license to carry out <b>shellfishing</b> on <b>shellfish banks</b> ."
DISTRIBUTION- ICM [harvesting and storaging shellfish for further delivery]	Recolector [harvester]	"In order to identify correctly the <b>product removed</b> from the production areas, every batch containing the product has to include a registration document [] This document will be issued by the designated authority upon the <b>harvester's</b> request"

#### Conclusions

- Cognitivist principles of concept structuring and naming can be applied in Terminology
  - Concept-term relation → motivation principle
  - Cognitive reasons for denominative variation
- First results of a cognitive approach of denominative variation in special language
